The first biennial was held in the city of Lund in 2006. During the subsequent years the biennial established itself as an important meeting point for the performing arts for a young audience.

Bibu is now the most important meeting place in Sweden for professional performing arts for a young audience.

Since 2014 the biennial is held in the city of Helsingborg, on the western coast of Skåne.

Using the watchword “Leave no one behind”, we will examine how we in the performing arts field can be part of **a social, financial and environmental change**



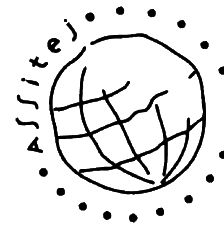
Bibu/AAG 2022 welcomes innovative international performances that are visioned, produced and creatively led by Indigenous Performing Artists

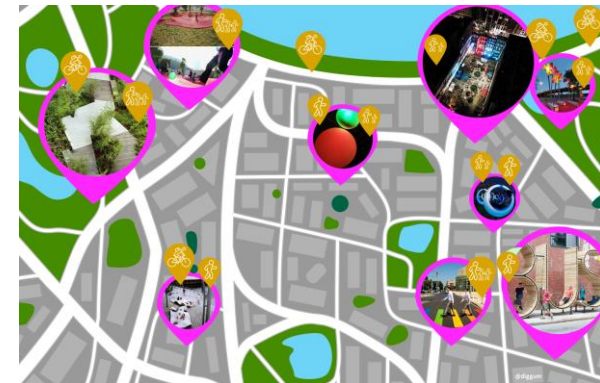
For the 2020 Next Generation Residency we plan to work with "placemaking" as a theme.

Placemaking is a multi-faceted approach to the planning, design and management of public spaces. How can cultural activities contribute to sustainable and inclusive cities?



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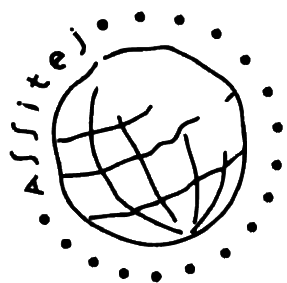
