March 20th is the ASSITEJ World Day of Theatre for Children and Young People and is celebrated worldwide through the campaign **Take a Child to the Theatre**.

This year's messages have been written by **Yvette Hardie** (South Africa), President of ASSITEJ, and the actor, director and writer **Yoshi Oida** (Japan).



ASSITEJ president Yvette Hardie says: "In this age where more and more people are being shunned, turned away at borders and airports, rejected because they come from a different class, ethnicity, language group or religion, it is the artist who has the capacity to provide a sense of belonging, of connection."

Yoshi Oida says: "Since I was born, I grew up mimicking my parents all the time. How to walk, how to eat, and how to talk; I learned all of these from mimicking my parents. Then from when I became old enough to understand things, taken by parents, I learned to go to the theatre. Theatre was for me, the magic country.."

ASSITEJ Fundraising campaign

Some countries use the campaign as a rallying call to ask for donations to ensure that children and young people who otherwise wouldn't have access to theatre get an opportunity to do so.

Last year ASSITEJ Italy raised 1400 euros from the campaign, through asking audiences to add a small donation to their ticket price. The money was collected and then donated to Jacaranda Theatre Arts Festival Festival in Zambia, and to SAFE (Southern African Festival for Children and Young People) in Zimbabwe, to aid audience access to these events. The determination for the funding was made by ASSITEJ Executive Committee after an open call.
